SPECIAL SUPPLEMENT INSERTING A PATCH

- Mark the area to be patched. Make sure you know what is underneath the area to be cut out.
- Cut out the area using your favorite cutting tool. Here an air powered cutting wheel is being used.



- Magnets can be used to hold the patch in place while welding. Do not weld on top of or near the magnets
- Tack weld the patch in place. Alternate the tacks from side to side and top to bottom to avoid overheating the metal which causes warping and ripples.





- Then go back and fill in between the tacks again in short lengths to avoid overheating.
- Grind and sand the welds until smooth. You can fill low spots and voids with stitch welding and regrind/sand until level.



If done carefully (or you are lucky like the picture at the right) the repair should be almost invisible. To see a video of this process visit the bodywork 5 page of www.m38jeepproject.com
